## Some Journals Now Library Use Only

Orbis Cascade member libraries in WA and OR are cooperating to maintain in perpetuity complete print runs of serials included in the JSTOR Arts & Sciences I and II, and the American Chemical Society online collections.

The goal is to protect two complete print runs of each title within the Orbis Cascade Consortium. Those libraries who are *\*not\** assigned retention responsibility for a given Distributed Print

Repository (DPR) title, may discard their volumes if they so choose.

The University of Washington has been designated the "library of record" for 134 of the 781 JSTOR titles. Mathematics Research Library is responsible for 19 titles which are now designated as *library use only*. The list of math and stat DPR titles are:

By a Memorandum of Understanding that was signed last year by UW Dean of Libraries Betsy Wilson and other participating library deans and directors, *DPR volumes are designated library use only*. The volumes themselves are being marked with a specially designed Alliance DPR bookplate. Math is also marking our volumes with a Library Use Only sticker on the spine of each volume. These volumes will remain on our shelves but may not be taken out of the library.

We expect that most patrons will be using the online version if they wish to print out an article. However, if you wish to make a copy from our paper volumes, you must do so from within the library. If you have money on your UW ID card (i.e. for food purchases, etc.), the UW ID card works in our copiers for printing or copying. Otherwise, you may buy \$5 reloadable copy cards from card dispensers such as the one near our circ desk.

### UW Libraries Budget Cuts

UW Libraries was assigned a 12% budget cut amounting to \$3.636 million effective July 1, 2009. Our budget process included a survey of all library units looking at physical visits, materials checkout, reference questions, etc. Each library unit was then ranked and evaluated for closure and consolidation.

The first tier included Fisheries-Oceanography, Chemistry, Physics-Astronomy, Drama, Social Work and Natural Sciences libraries. Fisheries and Chemistry libraries will be closing at the end of this quarter. Their collections will be stored and eventually shelved in the Suzzallo-Allen complex in one call number order, A-Z. The librarians and staff will transfer to Suzzallo. Physics-Astronomy Library will be administrated by the Physics and Astronomy departments as the Physics-Astronomy Reading Room with shorter hours and less library staff. For now, Social Work and Drama will remain open. Mathematics Research Library was placed in the second tier of library units. All library units will have shorter hours in 2009-2011.

Another area of budget impact on the libraries is our materials budget. The 12% cut on top of inflationary pressures means a near 20% cut of the materials budgets. I have been working with the library liaisons and committees in Applied Math, Stat, and Math this spring to identify \$40,000 worth of cuts to our journal subscriptions. Thank you all for participating in this very complex process. Your input is most valuable. Once the list is compiled, you will be notified. An all subjects list of cancellations will be posted later in the summer for review and comment. Decisions are finalized in early fall.

The Libraries is losing 29 positions—9 of them from layoffs. The remaining budget cuts are made from our operations fund—equipment, travel, etc. For more information, please see:
