Serials Cancellation Review: Comments Due by Oct. 10

The campus-wide list of unique journal titles to be reviewed for cancellation has been posted at:

The list of potential subscription cancellations at UW Seattle is presented for review and ranking as an online web form and contains over 1,000 titles from all subject areas, excluding Law and Health Sciences.

Please review and rank only the titles of relevance to your disciplines and areas of interest. The deadline for feedback is **October 10, 2009**.

We are using a two-tiered ranking system: 1 = Must keep; 2 = Keep if possible. Select the appropriate rank for each title in your areas of interest that you wish to keep. Leave the ranking as 'none' for all other titles. There is no need to select a ranking for titles that are not relevant to your areas of interest.

To use the online web form you will need to log in using your UW NetID and password. You may add comments in the "Comments" box to add any other relevant information to your ranking decisions. Be sure to click the "Update My Info" button to update your info and comments.

When you log in for the first time, you will see the full list of titles proposed for cancellation. You may sort by any of the fields using the green and red arrows. You may also filter by subject to only display titles in specific areas. The subject categories include Business, Engineering/Computer Science, Humanities/Fine Arts, International Studies, Sciences (including Psychology), Social Sciences, and Other. Math and stat titles are in the Sciences group. Due to the interdisciplinary nature of research, it is advised that you review related subject areas or search by title keywords.

At any point you may select a ranking from the pull-down options; those selections are automatically saved and added to your "My Rankings" list. If you change a ranking, it will be automatically updated in your "My Rankings" list. Once you are finished making your review and rankings, you can "Logout"

and your selections will be saved. All rankings will be shared with the appropriate subject specialist.

The dollar amount listed is the amount of credit to be received towards the subject fund's target if that title is cancelled. Usually this amounts to about one year's cost. Math's target is approximately \$40,000.

UW Libraries Consolidation Project BOOKS ON THE MOVE!

Books and journals are moving on every floor in Suzzallo & Allen Libraries. For current locations of books and journals, check this [link](#), check posted signs by the elevators, or ask at a service desk or request item through UW catalog. The print collections in Suzzallo and Allen Libraries are being integrated into a single call number range to make items easier to find and to make the collection less costly to maintain. Suzzallo journals are being shelved with books in the same call no. now. Any QA call numbers in Suzzallo/Allen Library should be located on Allen South 2nd.

Books and journals in the Fisheries-Oceanography Library and the Chemistry Library collections are being moved into Suzzallo/Allen as quickly as possible.

Librarians serving as the subject specialists for fisheries, oceanography, chemistry, biology, earth and space sciences, atmospheric sciences, environment and forestry will now be working out of the main Suzzallo Reference Area.

Faculty in Math, Stat, and Applied Math may check out a key to Math Research Library. Grad students in those three departments who have passed all their prelims may also check out a key to Math Research Library. Ask Martha or Sandra about borrowing a key.

Desktop Article Delivery Project Extended to June 2010



We will deliver journal articles from our print collection to your desktop at no charge for current UW students, faculty and staff.

Document Delivery Services

For current UW students, faculty, and staff at the Bothell/Cascadia, Seattle, and Tacoma campuses*, the UW Libraries will provide the following services:

- Obtain electronic copies of articles, either from the UW Libraries print collection or from another library, usually within one to two business days.
- Borrow books and other physical materials from other libraries, usually within 10-14 business days depending on shipping time.

To place a request, please log in to your [UW Libraries Interlibrary Loan account](#) using your UW NetID. If this is your first request, you will be asked to register.

More about the pilot project

This project is a response to the results of the UW Libraries 2007 triennial survey. When asked to choose from a list of possible new services, more than 70% of graduate students and faculty selected on-demand scanning of print journals free of charge. The long-term goal is to provide this service on a permanent basis.

As with our Summit service, there are no costs for you, but there are costs for the UW Libraries. These include staff, equipment, supplies, the fees charged by other libraries and copyright fees. Because of this, there are some limitations to the service.

*Limitations

- The [UW Law School](#) community is served by its own Library and is not part of this pilot project.
- Requests are for UW-related research only. If your request is for personal use, please see your public library.
- Mailing charges apply to send books to your home.
- Rare or fragile materials may not be available for scanning.

A digital repository is a system for disseminating and preserving scholarly work to researchers and other interested people around the world. UW Colleges, Schools, Departments and Research Centers can easily present their work to prospective students, faculty, granting institutions, as well as colleagues and other interested individuals around the world resulting in higher visibility for your work and your department's work.

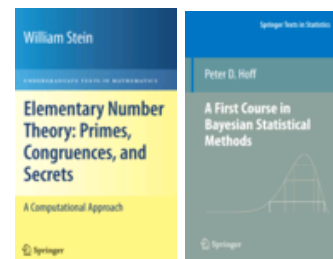
