WHAT IS SCHOLARLY COMMUNICATION?

Scholarly communication encompasses the creation, publication and accessibility of scholarship. In the library world the crisis in scholarly communication deals with the increasing inability of library budgets to meet high costs of journals and books.

Faculty can help with this crisis:

- Submit papers to reasonably priced quality journals.
- Retain your copyright so that you can freely distribute copies.
- Decline to review for or serve on editorial boards of unreasonably expensive journals.
- Archive your publications in the UW digital repository, DSpace.

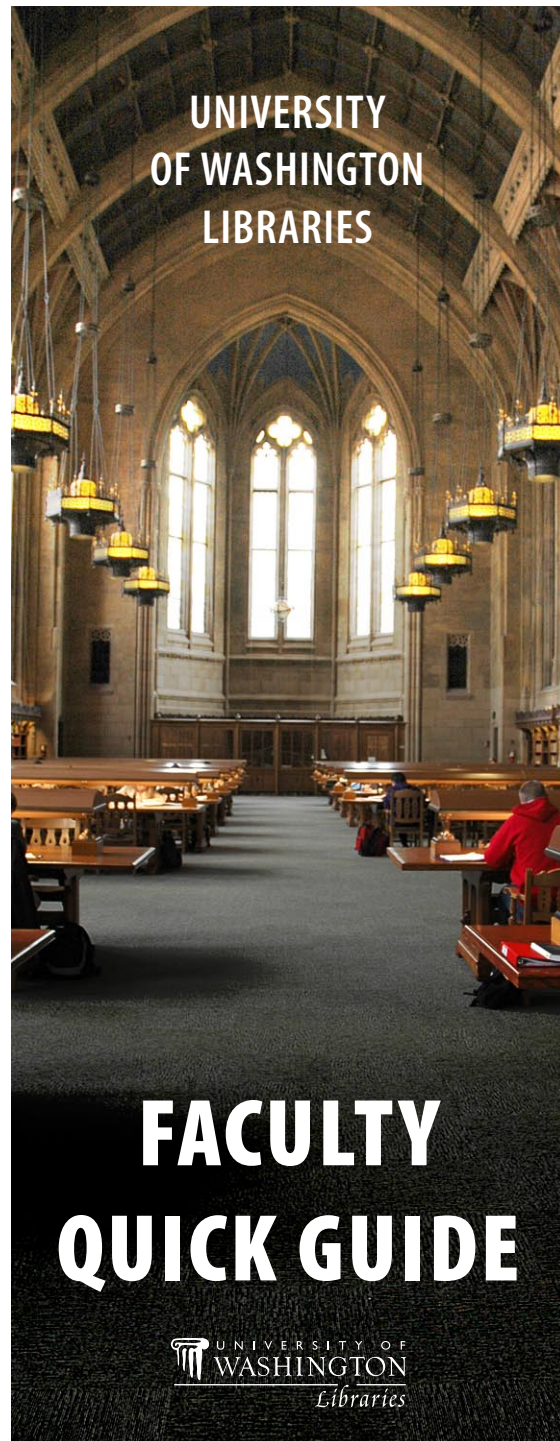
BOTHELL & TACOMA

YOUR LIBRARY

Your library is one of the premier academic research libraries in North America, with 21 libraries that stretch from Friday Harbor to Tacoma. The system includes the Suzzallo and Allen Libraries, the primary location for information and services in the social sciences and humanities; the Odegaard Undergraduate Library (OUGL) which houses the UWired Commons and the Center for Teaching, Learning, and Technology (CTLT); the Health Sciences Libraries (HSL); the East Asia Library; 15 specialized branch libraries; the UW Bothell/CCC Library; and the UW Tacoma Library.

Your library offers a collection of more than 6 million volumes and several million items in other formats. The Libraries website (www.lib.washington.edu) is your portal to library collections and services.

Your library was the winner of the 2004 Association of College and Research Libraries Excellence in Academic Libraries Award, recognized nationwide for the strength of its collections, excellent service programs, superb staff, and diverse facilities and innovation.

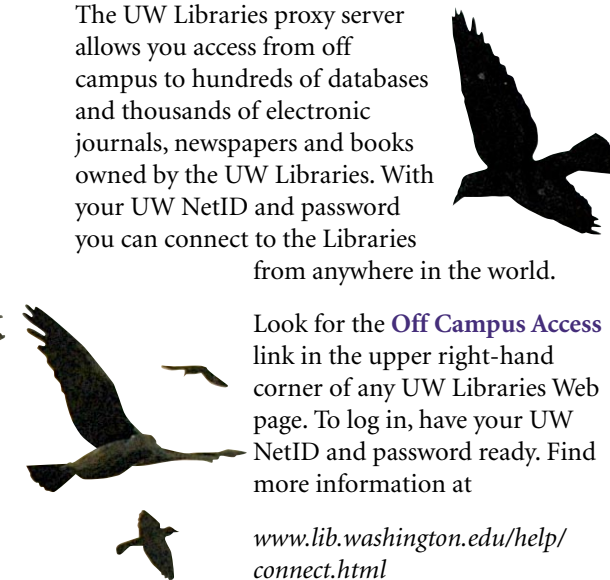
