

Station 11: Digital Audio Workstation

(2nd Floor, room 216)

This full function studio allows you to record, tweak, edit and master whatever audio project you can dream up. Reservations are accepted at the Information & Checkout Desk on the first floor or online. *(No Activity)*

The 3rd Floor is a designated **QUIET STUDY** area. Please be respectful in this no-talking zone. Need a place for group study? Find out more at **Station 13**.

Station 12: Reading Call Numbers

(3rd Floor, north)

Now you've got the location and number, but where's the book? Each item in the library is assigned a unique "call number" based on its subject matter. Call numbers can be tricky to decipher. Take a moment to read the poster for an explanation of the system. *(Activity 10)*

Station 13: Group Study

(3rd Floor, against the east wall)

Reserve a study room at the Information & Check-Out desk on the first floor, or online. Many of our rooms are equipped with DVD/VHS players, and all have wireless access. Group study space is at a premium on the UW campus, and our study rooms are very popular, so remember to plan ahead and book time in advance! *(No Activity)*

Station 14: Writing Help

(3rd Floor, room 326)

Get writing help while you're in the library! The Odegaard Writing & Research Center is open from Sunday to Thursday, 1:30pm to 4:30pm and 7pm to 11pm. Experienced writing tutors can help you with any stage of writing: from planning and grammar to writing and revision. *(No Activity)*

Self-Guided Poster Tour

Welcome!

There are many libraries at UW, but Odegaard is often the one students start out in. At the entrance, pick up an OUGL map, a map of the UW Libraries, and the Start Smart Activity Sheet. You're ready to begin.

Need help? Stop by the 1st floor Information Desk or 2nd Floor Reference Desk for assistance.

Station 1: Information & Checkout

(1st Floor, immediately in front of entrance)

Here, you can get quick directions, check out and renew books or headphones, and check out a study room. Take a moment to **activate your Husky Card** for library use and **create a PIN** number.

(Activity 1)

Your **PIN** allows you to access your account to see what you have checked out, place holds, renew online, or borrow materials from other UW and Summit Libraries.

Station 2: Using the Library Catalog

(1st Floor, next to the Info Desk)

Search the library catalog to find books, journals, videos and DVDs, and many other materials at the University of Washington Libraries. Search by title, author, or keyword, and then take note of the location, call number and status to find the item.

(Activity 2)

What if UW doesn't have the book you need? Click the **Search Summit** button on the library catalog to request items from other Pacific Northwest libraries. Still can't find it? Request the item online through **UWorld Express**.

Station 3: Finding Articles

(1st Floor, southeast corner)

On the open shelving in this area, you will find OUGL's print collection of periodicals (that is, magazines, journals, and newspapers). You can search for particular titles in the UW Libraries Catalog, and access many articles online.

(Activity 3)

Need help locating journal articles on a particular topic? Use the many helpful links from the Libraries' home page. Click **Research Databases** and select the most relevant heading from the list to get suggestions for databases and other resources.

Station 4: Course Reserves

(1st Floor northeast corner)

OUGL has the largest reserve collection of any library on campus. You can find your class reserves in the **Course Reserves** section of the Libraries Catalog, OR use **MyUW** to find and open course reserves for your classes—they're linked right off your course schedule. (Activity 4)

Station 5: Copy Center

(1st Floor, center, across from Course Reserves)

Pick up a course packet, print your resume on quality paper, or send a package FedEx from here! If you haven't done so already, you can establish a Husky Card account here, useful for printing or for food in the By George cafeteria in the basement of this building. (No activity)

Station 6: Media Center

(Mezzanine level)

Looking for something interesting to take home with you for the weekend? Now that you've linked your library barcode at the Information Desk, you can check out media items for 3 days! (Activity 5)

Station 7: Research Help

(2nd Floor, Reference & Research Help Desk)

Got a question, any question? This is the perfect place to ask it! Reference librarians can help you learn to navigate today's complex environment of Web pages, online databases, and electronic journal articles. But even in this Information Age, the best information isn't always what's available online! We have a collection of well-used reference books that can quickly answer some of your research questions. (Activity 6)

Station 8: Research on the Run

(2nd Floor, behind the Help Desk)

Did you know that you don't actually have to be in a UW library building to start your research? You can connect to UW-restricted resources from off campus using EZ-proxy, access electronic reserves, and even get research advice from a librarian through our Q&A Live online reference service—all without setting a foot out your door.

(Activity 7)

Use EZ-proxy to connect from home! Click the "Off-Campus" Access link from any UW Libraries Web page to access UW-restricted resources when you're away from campus. Log in with your UW Netid and password.

Station 9: Learning Commons

(2nd Floor)

There are a lot of great services available to you in this lab! Spend some time here exploring the lab computers—you can write a paper, check your email, listen to music (headphones are available for check-out), or get started on your own website. The lab consultants are here to help you if you need assistance.

(Activity 8)

Looking for a place to use your laptop? Wireless service is available on all floors of Odegaard Undergraduate Library.

Station 10: Printing

(2nd Floor North, by self-serve printer)

Use your purple **Quick Card** to pay for print jobs at the self-serve printers. Choose the default printer for self-serve black & white printing, or select the Copy Center or OUGL Computing Commons for jobs with special requirements, such as color printing, resumes and posters. Need to use cash? Print to the Copy Center.
