GUIDE

Robert Aldrich is a pediatrician who was born in 1917. He was a professor and executive officer of Pediatrics at the University of Washington School of Medicine from 1956 to 1962. He took a leave of absence to establish and direct the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development from 1962 to 1964. He returned to the University of Washington School of Medicine from 1964 to 1970, then served at the University of Colorado as Vice President for Health Affairs from 1970 to 1974 and as professor of pediatrics and preventive medicine from 1970 to 1980. He returned to the University of Washington in 1980 as clinical professor of pediatrics in the School of Medicine. His early research in biochemistry focussed on porphyrins. His interest broadened to urban policies for child health and development and he worked in this area through a variety of policy and funding bodies. He collaborated with Constantinos Doxiades at the Athens Center for Ekistics in the 1960s and 1970s. He was an advisor to the MacArthur Foundation in 1979 through 1981 and was a member of the Academy of Independent Scholars from 1978 to 1983.

The Aldrich papers were donated to the Libraries by Robert Aldrich in 1996. They were partially processed in 1996 and measure 14 cubic feet.
