

200 High School Students to Help On Local Farms

The critical need for harvest workers on the project farms was alleviated somewhat this week by the sign-up of approximately 200 youngsters as laborers from the local high school. With the high school officially closed for the harvest vacation, these 200 boys and girls ranging from 14 to 17 years of age signed up with the local placement office for farm employment.

However, before any of these youngsters were sent out to the harvest fields, all of them were sent through a general physical examination at the project hospital during the earlier part of this week. These examinations are a pre-requisite for all high school farm laborers.

A confirming report by the local hospital staff stated that a doctor's certificate of capability is necessary before young workers can be assigned. Dr. F. P. Richards of the local hospital staff conducted all examinations.
