## BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE AND GUIDE TO THE COLLECTION

William Earl Millikin was born in Oswego, Kansas, in 1890. He received his education at Baker University, Baldwin, Kansas, a Methodist school. This was followed by study at several other schools, including the University of Oregon, University of California and University of Washington. In 1919 he became Head of the History Department at Queen Anne High School; he also served as the school's athletic director. He remained in this position until 1930. At that time he became Northwest representative for Row Peterson, educational publishers, and stayed with them until 1932. In 1933, Millikin ran unsuccessfully for the City Council, but in 1934 was elected to the King County Auditorship by 17,000 votes. He remained in this position until he was elected to the mayoralty in 1941.

The 1941 election for Mayor was not a regular election. When Arthur B. Langlie was elected to the Governor's Office, he left an unexpired term as Seattle's Mayor, which had to be filled. The election was held in March and Millikin served only until June 2, 1942. He campaigned for re-election, but lost to William F. Devin. Despite his short term, he describes the term as being "...marked by important events. Seattle experienced the huge defense buildup, the imposition of rent controls, the Communist attempt to sabotage production at Boeing's, Pearl Harbor Day, removal of the Japanese, and the building of the Spokane Street viaduct during that period. Also, notable, was the setting up of the system of Civil Defense that was retained all during World War II."<sup>1</sup>

Both his terms as Auditor and Mayor are well-documented in the Millikin Papers. The majority of each of these subgroups comprise correspondence of various kinds: congratulatory, applications and recommendations, inter-departmental personal. There are also subject files of correspondence dealing with particular issues - censorship, national defense, streets and bridges, and the like. The names of correspondents have been indexed so that the researcher will find the material readily.

Another subgroup of particular interest is that of the Constitutional Amendment Committee, Against a Two Term Limit. At the time Millikin was County Auditor, the State Constitution specified that County officers (Treasurers, Auditors, Assessors, etc.) could serve only two terms. This was contrary to all other elected positions in the State. This Committee, of which Millikin was Chairman, attempted to repeal this Section of the Constitution. The Committee was composed of the State's county officers and had the support of the officers' professional association, but the Section was not repealed until 1948. Because Millikin was elected Mayor he remained Chairman of the Committee only through 1940, and these papers cover only the short period, 1939-40; they include correspondence, financial records, news releases, minutes, ephemera and related items.

Some of the positions Millikin held as one interested in civic affairs were the following: President, State Association of County Auditors, 1938; Captain, Field Artillery, Army Reserves; President of the Northwest Football League, President of the local Reserve Officers Association in 1937;
