GUIDE TO FREDERICK MORGAN PADELFORD PAPERS # 400-2 Part II

The second installment of the Padelford papers largely consists of the personal correspondence of his own immediate family. Because the correspondence does not center on one person, but on several, this collection has been organized upon slightly different principles. The papers of each member of the Padelford family have been treated as a separate collection; so there is a Frederick Morgan Padelford section, one for his wife, Jessie, and one for each of his children, Morgan, Eunice, Philip, and Charles. Most of the latter five sections consist of incoming and outgoing correspondence, and is not very voluminous.

In addition to the immediate Padelford family papers, is a following section which I termed the Pepper-Grassie papers, collected by Mrs. Padelford. These are papers (mainly letters) by and to her parents, George Dana Boardman Pepper and his wife Annie Grassie Pepper. In following the pattern established this subcollection has been organized around each of these two people. There is also a third part of these papers consisting of older Pepper-Grassie things (see the description of box 30 in the inventory.)

Following the Pepper-Grassie papers are the clippings, ephemera, and photographs for the entire collection.

By organizing the collection around eight different people, a more faithful representation of each person is given by his papers; as opposed to organizing them in a general, but more artificial series. One of the effects of this polycentric organization is that correspondence from one person may by found in all eight sections. Annie Pepper Varney's letters, for example, are found in 17 different folders. Therefore use of the name control index is more important for this collection than for many others; one cannot rely solely upon the inventory to find all the letters of one person. This is not true for all correspondents, but for enough to make it necessary to call attention to the fact.

Frederick Morgan Padelford was born in New England in 1875, son of Adoniram Judson Padelford and Julia Morgan. His father was a Baptist minister. Frederick attended Colby College in Waterville Maine where he met his wife-to-be, Jessie Elizabeth Pepper, the daughter of Colby's President, Dr. George D.B. Pepper. In 1899, Frederick graduated from Yale with his Ph.D. in English Literature. He and Jessie moved to Moscow, Idaho, where he taught at the University. In 1901 he came to the University of Washington where he held various positions including Professor of English, Chairman of the English Department, Dean of the Graduate School and Vice-President in charge of Faculties. He had considerable power in helping to shape the growth of the University. He died in 1942 while on his way to give the Presidential address to the Modern Language Association.

One of the more significant parts of the Padelford Collection is the general correspondence dealing with the A.A.U.P. academic freedom cases. He served on a subcommittee investigating a case at the University of Montana. The letters generated by the committee members are quite extensive, although they may give a better indication of the workings of a committee than of what occurred at Montana.

Also of special interest is the various drafts of the unpublished Spencer Allusion Book, which was to have been part of the Variorum Spencer that Padelford helped edit. It refers to allusions to Spencer's works from 1600-1700. I also find interesting the photographs, especially the older ones. While not works of art, they are interesting in a curious way.

Since much of the correspondence is with Frederick Padelford's family, his in-laws and other relatives, I have included the following schema delineating the various relationships.

Note: The boxes containing Clippings, Ephemera and Photographs of the entire Padelford family have been placed as major headings following the Subgroups which deal with F.M. Padelford's wife and children; instead of being placed immediately after the major sections dealing with F.M. Padelford's papers.
