Guide

BIOGRAPHY

Fred Bergman and his wife, Minnie, were Jewish community leaders in Seattle, Washington and supporters of Israel. Minnie was active in Hadassah for decades. She also was an amateur musician and belonged to the Ladies Musical Club. Fred served as president of B'nai B'rith Lodge No. 503. Fred Bergman died in 1991. The Bergmans had two sons, Elihu and Abraham. Elihu attended Reed College. After World War II, he assisted the Hagganah (Jewish resistance movement in Palestine) in the illegal transportation of Jewish Holocaust survivors to Palestine. He was later employed by the Mutual Security Agency in Washington. D.C.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

The Fred Bergman papers measure 2.39 cubic feet and span the years 1893 to 1998. They contain an equal amount of papers of Minnie Bergman and some of Elihu and Abraham Bergman, including letters documenting Elihu's travel to Palestine to assist with the Zionist movement and his brief internment in a refugee camp in Cyprus in 1947.

ARRANGEMENT

Subgroups were created for all four of the Bergmans. Letters in which both Fred and Minnie are addressed were put in Minnie's subgroup. Since many family letters are directed to multiple recipients, they were subgrouped by author.

ACQUISITION INFORMATION

This accession is composed of papers donated to the Libraries by Minnie and Elihu Bergman, Meta Buttnick and Shirley Guterson between 1984 and 1999.

PROCESSING INFORMATION

Processed in 1999, this accession is a merger of accession nos. 2975-2, 2975-3, 2975-4, 2975-5, #4392 (Minnie Bergman papers), #5932-1 (Elihu Bergman papers) and unaccessioned Elihu Bergman papers.
