GUIDE

Organizational

The Washington State Medical Association is the major professional organization of physicians in the state of Washington. The organization was founded in 1874 as the Washington Territorial Medical Society. In 1889 the name became Washington State Medical Society, reflecting Washington's new statehood. The name was changed to the present Washington State Medical Association in 1894. The Association represents the interests of physicians in matters of public policy and professional practice. It had a major role in promoting the establishment of the medical school at the University of Washington in 1945.

Scope and Content

Accession no. 4576 is organized into three series. The main series contains papers from a project to compile a history of medicine in the state of Washington in celebration of the 1989 state centennial. Dr. James Haviland directed the project, and co-authored the resulting publication, *Saddlebags to Scanners*. The papers include correspondence, planning notes, drafts of chapters, memoirs and other writings collected for the project, transcripts of oral history interviews (tapes have been retained by the King County Medical Society), photographs, and ephemera. The papers in this series date from 1981 to 1994, with the bulk from 1988 to 1991. Of particular note is the subseries containing the diaries of Dr. C. A. Smith, chronicling fifty years of his general practice in the Seattle area from 1901 to 1952.

The second series concerns the practice of pediatrics in the state of Washington. It includes correspondence and committee reports of the North Pacific Pediatric Society, which became the Washington State Pediatric Society. These papers date from 1955 to 1983.

The third series consists of copies of the minutes of the Washington State Medical Association's House of Delegates and those of its predecessors, 1873-1950.

Administrative Information

This accession was processed in December, 1995 by Carolyn S. McClurkan of West Sound Archival Services. Funding was provided by the Association. The accession measures 8 linear feet.
