Boxes 5-10: Personal files

Arrangement: Chronological; some separation within years by "series" (ex. letters, photos, particular productions); most productions he was involved with have separate files

Seattle content appears for the following years:

1951-53: Queen Anne High School Yearbooks, photos, and other ephemera (Box 5)

1956-59: UW School of Drama photos and school records; also programs, flyers, ephemera

from other Seattle productions (Box 5)

1982-1994: Performing and living in Seattle (Boxes 9 and 10)

Notes on contents in general:

Correspondence: ingoing and outgoing, official and personal

Photos: most labeled, some w/negatives; personal and professional

Clippings & Flyers: including reviews of his performances, and of personal interest

Legal and financial documents (ex. leases, school records, contracts)

Programs: from plays, rodeos, other performances

Original manuscripts: for skits, his resume & biographical notes

Magazines, newspapers, books: related to theater, gay community, New York and Seattle

Daily planners (1964-84): like journals, often stuffed with all of the above

Calendars (1984-93): also like journals

"Mixed Media": including film reels, audio cassettes, t-shirts, log books, address books

Some material preserved in plastic; most not
