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RESTRICTIONS
Two files (administrative records and data scoring sheets) contain names of survey participants and should be restricted. Data questionnaires are not identified by name.

DESCRIPTION

These records consist of respondent data questionnaires generated by a research study undertaken by the Regional Affairs Office of the School of Medicine. The purpose of the study was to help small rural towns hire doctors by identifying why some physicians choose to practice in communities of 10,000 or fewer people. The study surveyed present and immediate past participants in family practice residency programs in the University of Washington's affiliated network and in the University of North Dakota and Oregon Health Sciences University. The physicians were in their first, second or third years of residency or were graduated from the programs in 1986-1988. Spouses or partners were also surveyed.

The findings of this study were presented at a School of Medicine sponsored conference, "Physician Recruitment into Rural Practice," held at Boise (Id.) State University, October 10, 1989. These records include a copy of the conference abstract; survey results are presented at pages 11-16 and 27-35.
