

prosthetic deity whose power to affect every level of experience was taken for granted even as it was aggressively advertised. Just as moralistic justifications of what counted as valid military targets were reworked to guarantee air force prosperity, sexism was reconfigured to fit the first American era in which women were understood to be valid military targets and were taught strategies befitting civilian soldiers in a permanently imminent war.
