You are a school teacher and a member of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, a relatively new organization founded in Baltimore. Your task is to discover more about the education of African Americans during the first two decades of the 20th century. Some questions to explore are:

- How did you become a teacher? What colleges were open to African American women during the time?
- What were the conditions in schools for African American children?
- What did you teach?

Possible resource to use is *Education of the Black adult in the United States: an annotated bibliography*.

You've decided to leave Baltimore for the possibility of better work in Chicago. Your task is to discover more about the migration of African Americans from the south to the industrial centers of the north and midwest during WWI. Some questions to explore are:

- Why did African Americans migrate north?
- What sorts of job opportunities were available?
- What was the Black community like in Chicago during this time?
